

Getting to 15B Marine Parade, Millport, Isle of Cumbrae, KA28 0ED

Getting to Largs

From Glasgow	Transport
by Car	Largs is about 32 miles from Glasgow, and it takes just under 50 minutes to drive. If you are travelling with an electric vehicle, two charging points are available on the island of Cumbrae outside the Royal George Hotel. Postcode for sat nav Largs Port: KA30 8BG
by Train	The train from Glasgow to Largs takes 56 minutes. It is a short walk from the train station to the ferry terminal.
From Ayr	Transport
by Car	Largs Port is 33 miles from Ayr, and it takes about 50 minutes to drive. Postcode for sat nav Largs Port: KA30 8BG
by Train	Get the train to Kilwinning and change to a train for Largs. The journey takes about 70 minutes.

From Largs, take the ferry to Cumbrae. The ferry port in Largs is located on Fort Street. If travelling by car, you can't turn down the street shown, you have to go around the block.



Ferry at Largs.

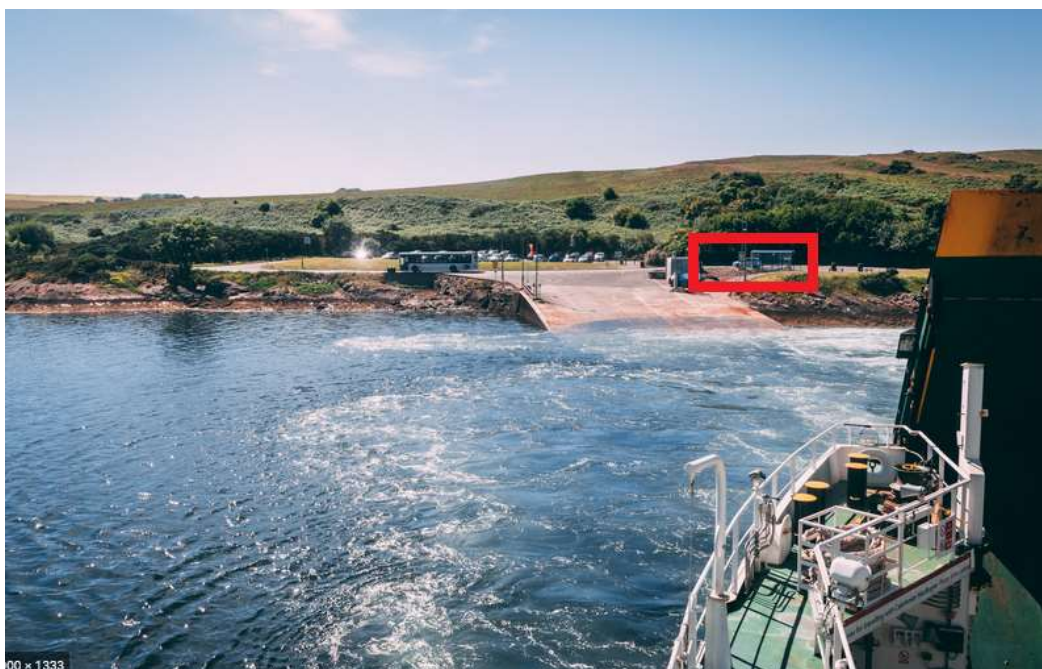
Buy your tickets at the ticket office (outlined in RED). You need to purchase your tickets BEFORE you get on the boat. You buy return tickets, and they are collected/scanned by the ticket collector, you will need your return portion when you travel back from Millport.

If you are travelling as a group and by ferry tickets together you must travel back the way as the same group, if you intend to return at different times, then tell the ticket person that and you'll need to do separate transactions (it's a bit of a silly system).



The ferry journey takes about 10 minutes. You will land on Cumbrae (shown below) and if travelling by public transport, you can get the bus in the area outlined in RED below.

By car, take a left when you leave the ferry slip.



Travelling by the coast road into the town.

By bus or car, it should take around 10-15 minutes to get to the town.

When you see the FSG pier (left of picture below), you are about to enter the town.



You travel past the Field Services Group (previously called Marine Station) complex (quite a large complex of buildings), then will follow the road round onto Marine Parade and into Kames Bay.

Marine Parade

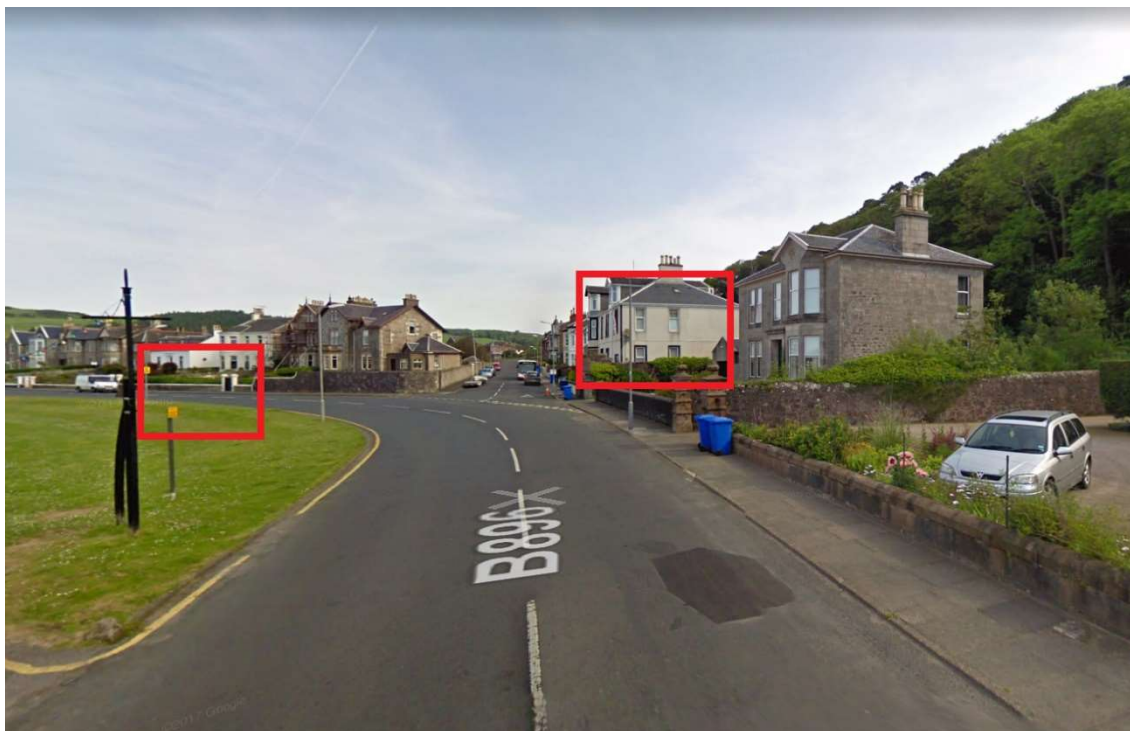


In the lower half of Marine Parade, you will pass the old boating pond on the left, and a bus stop (shown below).

If travelling on the bus, you want the NEXT stop.



Where the bus will stop is shown on the left in the photo below, and the house is highlighted in red on the right. If travelling by car, turn into the road where the house is and park on the street.



Grovehouse – Flat highlighted in RED.



Use the side entrance shown in RED.



You are heading around the back of the building. I live on the 1st floor using the entrance indicated on the photo. You are heading to the BACK of the building.



Below is the door to the stairs to the attic flat. There are 2 flats on the second floor and this entrance is just for the attic flats.

Go up the stairs, and the flat is on the left hand-side, clearly labelled as "The Lookout at Grovehouse".



Keysafe

The location of the key safe is as shown in red in the photo below (it's not actually in the photo as it happens, I need to take another picture !). The type of key safe is shown below in the picture on the right.



For info, the house numbering is a bit strange.
